Seed treatment	Average pre-sprouting, strong apical domination
Plot selection	Can be grown on all kinds of soils
Fertilisation	N ± P + K ± Mg +
Planting	Slightly narrow planting distance
Cultivation	Good structure of soil is required
Metribuzin	Not susceptible (7)
Harvesting	Harvest with care
Storage	Regular ventilation but not too much
Handling	Handle with care because of size
Point of Attention	Regular growth is important for a strong product in store
