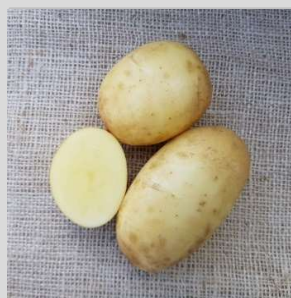


Cephora

Cultivation and storage (point of attention)

Seed treatment	Pre-sprouting not required
Plot selection	Avoid soils with high common scab potential
Fertilisation	N± / P+ / K++
Planting	Average planting distance, but plant deeper (4-5 cm)
Cultivation	Well shaped ridges with good soil coverage are required
Metribuzin	Average sensitive
Harvesting	
Storage	Quick drying after harvesting is important
Handling	No special handling required
